These whose names are under written, were called forth,
 and desired to take notes, of the death of John Kelly, Dec
 16th 1685, what was saw as followeth; the child was
 brought forth, and layd upon a forme, by the good wife Vestrey,
 and good wife Wayles, and the face of it beinge discovered,
 good wife Peires was desired, by John Kelly to come up to it
 and to handle it, the child was purged a little at the
 mouth. The good wife Peires wiped the corner of the child
 mouth with a cloth, and then she was desired, to burne up
 the sleeve, of the same. and shee did endeavour to doo it, but
 the sleeve beinge some what strait, shee could not well doo
 it, then John Kelly himselfe ripped up both the sleeves of the
 armes, ~~from the elbow to the top of the~~ and upon
 the back side of both the armes, from the elbow to the top of
 the shoulders were black and blew, as if they had bin burnt
 or beaten; after this the child was burne ouer, upon the
 right side, and soe upon the belly, and then there came
 such a sent from the torse, as that it caused some, to
 depart the room, as Gregorie Woberton, and George Graue,
 then the child beinge burnt againe, and layd into the coffin,
 John Kelly desired them to come into the roome againe,
 to see the child face, and then was saw upon the right
 cheek, of the child face, a reddish fawny great spot, which
 touched a great parte of the cheek, it beinge on the side
 next to good wife Peires where shee stood; this spot or
 blaine was not sent before the child was burnt; and
 the armes of the child did appear to be very limber, in
 the handlinge of them; Thomas
