Rebecca Smite aged about 75 years testified as followeth
 that formerly beinge at Jonathans Gilberts house about 14 daies
 together: Goodwife Gilbert the wife of ~~Jonathans Gilbert~~ had
 a blacke Cappy which she had lent to Katherine Harrison, and Katherine
 Harrison desired desired to have the faide Cappy, but Goodwife Gilbert
 refused to sell it to Katherine, after Goodwife Gilbert wore the faide
 Cappy and when she had the Cappy on her head her shoulder and head was
 much afflicted, after the Cappy beinge pulled of, Goodwife Gilbert faide
 she was well, againe after Goodwife Gilbert wore, or put on the faide
 Cappy: then she was afflicted as before, the faide Cappy beinge
 againe pulled of, Goodwife Gilbert againe faide she was well. thus
 beinge afflicted severall times, it was suspected to be by witchcraft
 after the faide Rebecca Smite, her selfe the Cappy was burned.

And further the faide Rebecca affirmed that she had bene afflicted
 round a yeare last past, beinge suddenly taken her thigh and loygs
 beinge stiff like a stick, and her face full fire, havinge strange fittes
 in her muzz that she the faide ~~Rebecca~~, after faide in the hearinge
 of her married Gaudrey, she thought or doubted that some evil
 person had bewitched her, but this bene the faide Rebecca and the
 family doe affirme that since her last past past she hath bene much
 better, her fittes, of the sufferance of afflictions have bene quite taken
 away and removed on the Lords day since her faide first affliction
 first and her family have observed that she was especially most afflicted on
 the sabbath day, but now this last day last, she hath not onely bene
 freed of the fittes aforesaid, but also hath found her selfe well, executing
 pure righteousness as doe all men should also dated the 12 of October 1663.
